## HIGHLIGHTS:

Engaged in the practice of law for over twenty years with strong record of achievement of results for clients. More than sixteen years experience in private practice.

Practice of law presently limited to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals.

Formerly the leading immigration practitioner in the CNMI. Subjected to a campaign commencing in January of 2013 to destroy ability to advocate effectively in the CNMI on behalf on foreign nationals, the economically disadvantaged, and politically disenfranchised in ways offensive to prevailing political, economic, and social elites. That campaign began with an unprecedented action in January 2013 commenced in the CNMI Supreme Court by the chairman of the Disciplinary Committee of the CNMI Bar Association seeking imposition an interim suspension from the practice of law wholly unsupported by the disciplinary rules and despite complete absence of legal standing or capacity on the part of the Disciplinary Committee to sue or be sued.

Following a compressed hearing schedule disallowing the time requested to meaningfully respond, and despite numerous irregularities, the CNMI Supreme Court proceeded to issue an interim suspension on February 1, 2013, effective immediately. This action triggered a summary suspension by the Board of Immigration Appeals from practice before the Board, immigration courts, and the Department of Homeland Security. That suspension can be set aside upon motion duly brought and supported, but such request has not been made as it is deemed preferable to concentrate instead on a limited number of matters and on defending against the wrongful disciplinary proceedings.

In the CNMI Superior Court, the campaign continued with proceedings where no charges were ever proven by evidence but instead procedural devices were employed to avoid decision on the merits and the Court proceeded to order disbarment in June of 2013. Timely appeal was taken to the CNMI Supreme Court. However, during the final months of 2013 and the first six months of 2014, a number of hostile actions were taken in the Superior Court. In December of 2015, a divided Commonwealth Supreme Court affirmed the Superior Court disbarment order. Defended against reciprocal discipline, and the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ultimately declined to impose reciprocal discipline; however the U.S. District Court for the Northern Mariana Islands imposed suspension from practice.

Proven record of over 40 years working successfully in multi-cultural environments. Strong oral and written communication skills.

In 2014, unsuccessfully sought election to the Senate of the Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature. In 2016 a delegate pledged to Bernie Sanders for the Democratic National Convention in Philadelphia in July, chairman of the Sanders preference group in the Northern Mariana Islands delegation, and the NMI Delegation representative to the Platform Committee.
